

## Metal Bead Immersion Workshop Tools and Supply List

October 22-23, 2016

Bring any of your favorite hand tools and flex shaft tools that you normally use in any class. I will supply each student with a kit of specific tools and accessories. The cost will be approximately \$15.00 payable to the instructor.

Tools and supplies you should bring:

- Saw frame and 3/0 blades
- Bees wax or some type of saw blade lubricant
- Files – round, flat, ½ round – preferably cut #2
- Steel bench block (if you have one)
- Design stamps and any other texturing tools
- Miter jig (if you have one)
- Needle files
- Calipers
- Steel ruler
- Ultrafine point Sharpie
- Scribe
- Divider
- Sandpaper – 240 and 320 grit
- Optivisor or some type of magnification
- Safety glasses
- Assorted pliers
- Shears and flush cutters
- Solder – hard, medium and easy in both sheet and wire
- Solder pick
- Flux
- Tweezers
- Insulated cross lock tweezers
- Drill bits – various sizes to make holes up to 14 gauge
- Tube cutting jig (if you have one)
- Binding wire
- Circle template (if you have one)
- Charcoal block (if you have one)
- Old towel

You can use whatever metal you are most comfortable with – sterling, brass or copper. These beads take on a more unique style when the metals are mixed.

#### Metal sheet

- 18 gauge – 1 piece of 1x2 inches (this is for one bead. You may opt to make more than one.)
- 20 gauge – 6x6 inches
- 24 gauge – 1x2 inches (this is for one bead)

#### Wire

- Sterling – 1 foot each of 20, 16 and 18 gauge

I will have extra metal if you need to purchase more.

Be sure to wear closed toe shoes. Bring paper and pencil for taking notes!
